

## MORNING TIME

This month let your child wake up to, "Good morning! God made another wonderful day for us to enjoy!"

Throughout the day, lead your child in thanking God for the things you enjoy that God made.



## CAR TIME

Since God made everything, let's turn Drive Time into a fun game of, "Look What God Made!" First,

place your Creation Station hanging card on your rearview mirror. As you drive along, take turns naming things you see by saying, "God made the (name what you see)" and then see if you can name what day it was made. Look at your Creation Station hanging card to check your answers. Soon you'll be a creation pro!



## BATH TIME

Help your child count his body parts during bath time this week. How many eyes did God make?

One, two. How many fingers did God make? One, two, three ... ten! How many ears did God make? One, two. Continue doing this as long as your child is interested. End bath time by reminding your child that God made people, and He loves us very much.



## CUDDLE TIME

Cuddle up with your child and pray. "Dear God, it is so amazing to think about how You made everything.

Please help us to take a day to rest and enjoy all the things You made the way You did. Help us to work hard when it's time to work and then rest when it's time to rest. I pray tonight You will give (*name of child*) good rest. Help him to never forget that You made the world and everything in it. We love You, God. In Jesus' name, amen."



## PLAY TIME

Make a family collage together of all the things God made. Cut pictures from magazines or print them from a computer and glue them to a piece of construction paper or white copy paper. Write the words, "God made it!" at the top and put it on the fridge. Talk about how no matter where we look we can see things God made, because God made everything!



Your preschooler is continuing to learn about all the things God made this month. He's about to find out the very best thing that God made—people. The look on a preschooler's face when he learns that he's part of the creation story is priceless. God made it all, and God made him. And God made you.

Spend some time in front of the mirror with your preschooler and thank God for everything you see. Thank Him for your eyes to see, your nose to smell, and your teeth to bite yummy pizza. Thank Him for that crazy cowlick that you got from your grandma on your mom's side and that extra dose of freckles you got on one cheek. Thank Him for things that make you uniquely you. Remember, God made you. You are His creation, and He loves every single hair on your head—even that crazy curly one.
